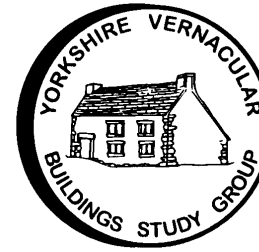

## The Yorkshire Vernacular Buildings Study Group

Vernacular buildings are those which are typical for an area, built from local materials and following a local 'style'. By studying these buildings in detail, and using oral and documentary evidence, the Group is building up a picture of the different local styles in Yorkshire. When a building has been studied, the plans, drawings and a written report are filed in the Group's archives, and a copy sent to the owner/occupier. With their agreement, these reports are made available for wider research by being deposited at the Yorkshire Archaeological Society in Leeds, and with the National Monuments Record in Swindon. Publications include the annual journal *Yorkshire Buildings*, which contains articles, reports of buildings surveyed, and news of related activities. A regular 'Newsheet' gives details of courses, publications and future events.

Membership of the Group is open to anyone interested in vernacular buildings. The Group is also interested to hear of any buildings to investigate.
